The Kiwanis Story

Kiwanis was founded in 1915 and has grown to an international organization with over 295,000 members in over 8,434 clubs in 74 nations and geographic areas.

The Kiwanis Club of Davis is celebrating 50 years of service to the Davis community in 2008. The club was founded in 1958 after a series of exploratory organizational meetings in the spring of that year. The formal organizational meeting was held in the basement of Phil's Grill in Davis on June 2, 1958. Red Francisco was elected "temporary" President at an early meeting, but was transferred by his company before the club was actually chartered on September 13, 1958 and Ed Jensen served instead as the first President.

The Club has since sponsored a second club in Davis, the Kiwanis Club of Greater Davis, and is proud to sponsor an active Key Club, a high school service club, at Davis Senior High School. A college student organization, Circle K, is sponsored at UCD by the Kiwanis Club of Greater Davis.
